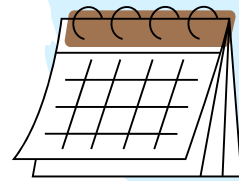

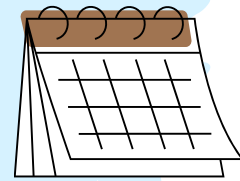

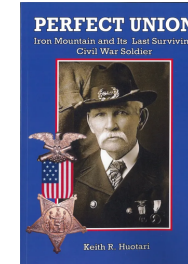
### ITSY BITSY STORYTIME

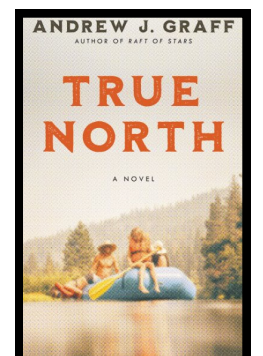


### AUTHOR TALK: Andrew Graff
